Unair Faculty of Nursing Visit to Women's and Children's Hospital and Royal Adelaide Hospital with Flinders University



The Collage of Nursing and Health Sciences at Flinders University in Adelaide, Australia, which began on October 6-October 21, 2017. This activity is one of the collaborative implementations of the Faculty of Nursing at Airlangga University with Flinders University. Today, October 10, 2017 coincides with World Mental Health Day, our group from the Unair Nursing Faculty with a group from Shandong University and CQMU China visited several hospitals in the Royal Hospital and the Adelaide Women's and Children's Hospital. The Royal Adelaide Hospital that we visited was a new building that was inaugurated in September 2017 because it was previously approved and was in another area. Adelaide Royal Hospital is a government hospital that has several services in the fields of health, surgery, emergency, mental health, outpatient care and services, and has excellent spinal rehabilitation and acute rheumatism services.

The Women's and Children's Hospital has several health facilities and services. Other facilities and health services that are owned by the Women's and Children's Hospital received: School Hospital, Starlight room, clown teacher teacher, sacred room, Playdeck and Play Therapist. Hospital school is intended for children who are undergoing treatment. They can come to class every day from 09:30 to 12.00 and start again at 13.00 until 15.00, where teachers are assigned under the Australian Ministry of Education. Hospital schools have two services, namely classrooms and treatment rooms. Services in the class are for children with conditions that allow for mobilization. While inpatient services are intended for children whose conditions cannot be mobilized. At the School Hospital children can learn according to their individual needs and according to the material obtained at school, including in doing homework.

Other facilities and services are starlighted rooms. Starlight is an independent institution in Australia that cares for children and spends providing entertainment to sick children. In the starlight room there are several games provided outdoors, handicrafts, play stations, board games, watching movies, and clown shows. Here children can play while receiving therapy to be given. Another important facility in the Women's and Children's Hospital is the Sacred Room. The sacred space is a special place provided for parents and also children who are taking care of the hospital in order to worship or ask for help.

Through hospital visits it is hoped that it can add to our knowledge of how child care in hospitals can address the problem of stress hospitalization in children and parents so that treatment and treatment therapies in hospitals become more optimal.

In supporting UNAIR for the TOP 500 World Class University Faculty of Nursing, Airlangga University held a Short Exchange Program. On 1 - 12 October 2018 the Faculty of Nursing sent 3 female representatives (Annisa Fiqih I., Heni Murti and Carina Rega) to participate in a short exchange program to UNAIR Faculty of Nursing partner universities in Australia, namely the School of Nursing and Midwifery - La Trobe University Australia. While at La Trobe University, we learned a lot of things that we have not encountered in UNAIR's nursing faculty. Like how to treat wounds, treatment at the ICU in hospitals in Australia that has a HellyPad foundation, then learn about Aboriginal tribes of indigenous Australians. Then we also followed the clinical practice in the wound department at Alfred Hospital. In addition, we also study in various hospitals that work with La Trobe such as Royal Melbourne Hospital, Northern Hospital, Alfred Hospital, primary health care and also elderly health care. Then we also try to enter the Practicum Lab on the La Trobe campus. Inside the Lab it's really like the atmosphere of an action room in reality. With the support of adequate technology so students can truly face real patients.

Diary Travel Exchange Lectures and Students at Malaya University



Airlangga University has a target to penetrate the world rank 500 as a world class university in 2019. The Faculty of Nursing also plays an active role in supporting the university. One of them is through teacher exchange activities. In 2017, the Faculty of Nursing, Airlangga University had an MoU in collaboration with Malaya University, Malaysia. In order to develop cooperation in the three Dharma Colleges between the two universities, they have agreed to the activities of the second exchange teacher from October 22 to November 2, 2018. The activity, which will be attended by two lecturers from the Department of Nursing, Mental Health and Community, discussed about the action plan further further related to the joint research research in 2019, nursing care in hospitals in Malaysia, and other academic activities. Malaya University (UM) is a public research university located in Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia and this University is a managed university in Malaysia.

Malaya University's history is rooted in Singapore by establishing King Edward VII Medical School on September 28, 1905. Malaya University was founded in 1949 October in Singapore by joining King Edward VII Medical School and Raffles College (founded 1929). On January 15, 1959, it was founded in Singapore and others in Kuala Lumpur. In 1960, the second government changed the two divisions of the University of Malaya to become a separate autonomous national university, located in Singapore (later to become the National University of Singapore) and the other in Kuala Lumpur (retaining the name of the University of Malaya). Legislation was passed in 1961 and Malaya University was established on January 1, 1962.

At present the University of Malaya has more than 2,500 faculty members. In 2012, Malaya University was granted an autonomous status by the Ministry of Higher Education. At present, the University is divided into 12 faculties, 2 academies and 3 centers, namely: Faculty of Law, Faculty of Engineering, Faculty of Dentistry, Faculty of Medicine, Faculty of Built Environment, Faculty of Economics and Administration, Faculty of Business and Accounting, Faculty of Education, Faculty of Science, Faculty of Language and Linguistics, Faculty of Arts and Social Sciences, Faculty of Computer Science and Information Technology, Malay Study Academy, Academy of Islamic Studies, Cultural Center, Sports Center, and Foundation Study Center (Malaya University). In 2018, QS World University Rankings ranked UM ranked 87th in the world, ranked 24th in Asia, Ranking in Southeast Asia and top ranked educational institutions in Malaysia.

Having the opportunity to exchange the teacher and students this year on an ongoing basis are 2 lecturers from the Department of Soul and Community and 4 students, each of which 2 students are students and 2 nurses. Two lecturers from the Department of Soul and Community are Dr. Hanik Endang Nihayati, SKep, Ns, MKep and Mrs. Rista Fauziningtyas, SKep, Ns, MKep and from the Basic Department, KMB and Critical are Dr. Kusnanto, SKp, MKes. While the exchange master students have the opportunity to receive are Gabby Novikadarti Rahmah and Ayesie Natasa Zulka whose age are Nursing Masters students in class 10. Whereas from continuous exchange S1 students can be exchanged with Timotius Dwi Kurnianto and Yenny Paramita.

Departing from Juanda Terminal 2 by Lion we depart at 10:00 and arrive at Kuala Lumpur International Airport (KLIA) at 13.45 and there is no time difference between Indonesia and Malaysia. Arriving at the airport we follow the directions for baggage claim. The experience of using this Lion airline must be landing at terminal 1 or KLIA only and not KLAI 2 so it is a bit complicated we have to go through a series of security checks and the KLIA airport system first. After that, we must pass through the Malaysian Immigration examination section. Finally, we have to travel using the free Aero Train KLIA 1 airport facilities which will take you to the baggage claim and then to the KLIA exit.

Strengthen Collaboration and Enrich Experience Through Outbound Teacher and Student Programs to the Nursing Faculty of Naresuan University, Thailand



In line with efforts to support and achieve world-class universities, the Faculty of Nursing implements a teacher and student program beyond every year by sending faculty and student staff to overseas universities in collaboration with Airlangga University. In 2018 the Faculty of Nursing sent 3 lecturers and 4 students to the Nursing Faculty of Naresuan University, Thailand. Faculty delegations carry out assignments for teachers and outbound students on November 4-16, 2018.

Airlangga University Delegation was well received by the Dean of FoN of Naresuan University, Assoc. Chommanard Wannapornsuri and Honorary President of Naresuan University Thailand Prof. Dr. Kanchana Ngourungsi. In a meeting between delegates from Airlangga University, President Naresuan University welcomed the collaboration between the two Universities. The teacher and student program is expected to be a medium for mutual information about the nurse education curriculum, the Nursing Master, opportunities to carry out dual degree programs, joint research, and career development and nurse training in responding to global challenges.

Besides about matters related to academic activities on campus, Unair delegates also had the opportunity to visit the Library, University of Naresuan Hospital, Pitsanuvej Hospital, Phromphiran Hospital, Tha Thong District Children's Development Center, Plaichumpol Health Promotion Hospital, Pitsanulok area such as the Historical History Center Chan Palace of Pitsanulok Province, Thailand's Sukhotai Province, is familiar with traditional Thai medicine such as Thai massage, herbal treatments and local wisdom in Thailand.

Some things can be a positive experience and can be applied by the Nursing Faculty of Airlangga University, including the use of practical learning methods using Simman and Simmam simulations which are very useful for growing students who think critically and to be able to help children. managed by FoN Naresuan University to accommodate the needs of childcare centers (TPA) which are managed by taking into account the growth and development of children, strengthening not health promotion in health care and various positive lessons to be adopted in learning at the Faculty of Nursing at Airlangga University, and to be implemented in Indonesia generally.

One of the Exchange Program visits was at JRCKICN (Kyushu International Red Cross Nursing College of Japan) in Munakata, Japan. Unair Faculty of Nursing entourage arrived at Fukuoka Airport on July 3, 2019 and immediately conducted representative activities at JRCKICN with an introductory session with international class students consisting of 5 people and lecturers from Prof. Satomi Ogawa (JRCKICN lecturer) took part in the disaster.

The main lecture and discussion of the first week of the Exchange Program was about natural disasters including mitigation of natural disasters, because as we discussed, Japan was very advanced and responsive when facing the 2011 tsunami disaster. JRCKICN has a food storage warehouse to be used as foodstuff during a disaster. The food ingredients are packaged in one pack and can be used for 2 days. The group was invited to tour and see the condition of the food that was there.

Get to know more about the Nursing Research Methodology

at La Trobe University Australia



On Thursday, August 22, 2019, we are FKP Airlangga students, had the opportunity to take part in the Nursing Research and Methodology class with Ms. Rachel Comer. The cold temperature that morning, did not stop us from going to the West Peribolos (PW) building where the lecture took place. At 09.30 we were on campus to prepare for classes which would finish at 10:00. When we arrived at the Peribolos Barat (PW) lecture hall, we were warmly pleased by La Trobe University students. The number of students studying in one class is not too much, around 15-20 students with the concept of a workshop class. We had a conversation with several other students before class began. At 10:00 right, Ms. Rachel Comer came, we began today's lecture with the topic "How to make a good critical assessment of qualitative research journals". As an opening, Ms. Rachel Comer explains what things need to be discussed in conducting critical assessments in qualitative journals. Not only explaining the material, Ms. Rachel also gave a small discussion in the middle of an explanation that was able to bring up critical thinking patterns for students. After the material was given, Ms. Rachel then gives exercises to students in group form. Here, we present two qualitative journals and ask to criticize them, from the background to the discussion. Each group is also given a handout that contains questions that can guide students to think critically about the contents of the journal to the conclusion, whether the journal is good or not for us to use as a reference for the final project. After 30 minutes of discussion, we then published to publish the results of our discussion in the study of 2 journals.

The second session of the workshop today discussed the topic of "Research Ethics". Here we discuss instructions from the research ethics in Australia, how the procedures are and what instructions are used in the administration of research ethics. At the beginning of the workshop, Ms. Rachel explains the history of the importance of ethics in research. Then we had a small discussion about examples of ethically rejected research that had taken place in Australia. After giving the material and a small discussion, we then gave it to the group and gave a case study. The case study form is in the form of a research proposal submitted to the ethics team at the hospital and here students act as a research team to submit a proposal that is needed or not. Here, we get a lot of information from friends who have worked in hospitals related to the procedures for conducting research ethics in hospitals. After 30

minutes of discussion, we gathered together to present the results of the group discussion. At 12.00 the learning activity ends. Through this class, we learn a lot about special nursing research regarding critical assessment and ethical research. Do not forget to also please new friends who are fun.

Tuesday, October 8, 2019, 8 students and 2 lecturers from the Faculty of Nursing at Airlangga University visited the University Malaya Medical Center (UMMC). Before visiting UMMC, our group of two Student Exchange Program was picked up by Dr. Tang Li Yoong as a lecturer at Malaya University. We were ushered into the Nursing Science Department, Faculty of Medicine meeting room. First, there is a brief explanation of the University of Malaya by Dr. Chong Mei Chan, he revealed Universiti Malaya was ranked 87th in the world in 2019. It took a lot of effort and sacrifice to get to that point, said Dr. Chong. Next is an explanation of the Bachelor's program delivered by Dr. Lee Wan Ling. The current Bachelor program consists of 17 first-year students, 6 in the second year, 23 in the third year and 8 in the fourth year. Explanation of the Master Program in Nursing Program, Faculty of Medicine delivered by Dr. Chui Ping Lei The Master Program is taken in two years, consisting of 42 credit hours. The majority of learning is practice carried out in hospitals. The last explanation was given by Dr., Vimala Ramono regarding Nursing Research conducted by Master Program students there. There, we were also treated to Malaysian specialties, namely nasi lemak and various other Malaysian snacks.

At 14.30, we headed for UMMC (University Malaya Medical Center (UMMC)). This hospital is a tertiary hospital as well as a teaching hospital. UMMC itself was established in 1968. Consisting of 2268 nursing staff that has a classification distinguished by the uniform color used. the dark uniform color worn shows the more experienced and trained nurses, as an teaching hospital, UMMC has a diploma education program to prepare superior health workers and can be placed at UMMC itself, we are invited to see how the rooms are there "First we went to the geriatric room. There were all patients aged 65 years treated in this room. Patients with indications of disease transmission were differentiated and a special room was provided (isolation). Then we looked at the gynecology room. There was a lavender room which was reserved for women and a castor's room for man The next room that we kun

jungi is a cardiology room. This room is divided into two parts namely a special section for patients with post cardiology surgery and a cardiology patient stabilization room. Today's activity was closed by eating together at the UMMC food court and returning to the inn to rest.
